#### Advice Letter PCE/No. 4E

RE: PENINSULA CLEAN ENERGY AUTHORITY REQUEST FOR LOCAL RESOURCE ADEQUACY WAIVER FOR THE 2020-2022 COMPLIANCE PERIOD

#### **EFFECTIVE DATE**

Peninsula Clean Energy Authority requests that this Tier 2 Advice Letter become effective on October 31, 2019, which is the date of this submission.

**TIER DESIGNATION:** Tier 2 Designation

#### **PURPOSE**

Pursuant to California Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") Decision ("D.") 06-06-004, D.07-06-029, D.19-02-022, D.19-06-026 and Section 24 of the Commission's 2020 Filing Guide For System, Local, and Flexible Resource Adequacy Compliance Filings ("2020 Filing Guide"), Peninsula Clean Energy Authority ("PCE") hereby submits this Tier-2 Advice Letter requesting a waiver of certain local Resource Adequacy ("RA") requirements. The specific local areas and time-periods covered by this waiver request are market-sensitive and confidential, and are provided to the Commission in PCE's supporting narrative, provided as Appendix A to this Advice Letter.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Under D.06-06-064, the Commission established a waiver process available to load serving entities ("LSEs") that were unable to meet their assigned RA obligation. As discussed further below, the Commission established specific standards that LSEs must demonstrate in requesting waivers. These waiver requests are required to be submitted at the time the LSE files its local RA compliance showing. In D.19-02-022, the Commission extended the one-year local RA requirement to a three-year local RA requirement and extended the local RA waiver process for a commensurate period.

In D.19-06-026, the Commission adopted the requirement that local RA waivers must be submitted through a Tier 2 Advice Letter process. This process requires service of the Tier 2

Advice Letter to the service list in the open RA proceeding, with confidential information redacted, as necessary, in addition to the submission of the Advice Letter to the Energy Division.

PCE's request for waiver of local RA deficiencies is largely based on lack of depth or visibility of available resources for contracting. Once 2020-2022 local RA capacity requirements were received, PCE purchased every available MW to meet its 2020-2022 local RA requirements. Due to local RA market activity, PCE understands that the issue may be a problem within the local RA market generally, rather than one specific to any LSE. PCE remains committed to working with the Commission and other stakeholders to address this problem and other reliability concerns.

Through this Advice Letter submittal, PCE seeks a waiver for its 2020-2022 local RA requirements for certain PG&E subareas. This request is being made subject to the local RA waiver process originally adopted in D.06-06-064, and most recently articulated in the 2020 Filing Guide. As detailed in PCE's Appendix A supporting narrative, PCE meets the waiver requirements set forth in the 2020 Filing Guide.

### REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL TREATMENT

The Appendices to this Advice Letter contain highly market sensitive information regarding PCE's RA procurement efforts, business practices, and confidential RA supply data. The basis for this request is provided in the attached Confidentiality Declaration.

#### STANDARD FOR LOCAL RESOURCE ADEQUACY WAIVERS

The standards for submitting and assessing an LSE's local RA waiver request are primarily set forth in D.06-06-064 and outlined in Section 24 of the 2020 Filing Guide, which states:

An LSE requesting a waiver must make such request at the time it files its Local RAR compliance showing. The waiver request must include both of the following:

- (1) a demonstration that the LSE reasonably and in good faith solicited bids for its RAR capacity needs along with accompanying information about the terms and conditions of the Request for Offer or other form of solicitation, and
- (2) a demonstration that despite having actively pursued all commercially reasonable efforts to acquire the resources needed to meet the LSE's local procurement obligation, it either
  - (a) received no bids, or
  - (b) received no bids for an unbundled RA capacity contract of under \$51 per kW-year or for a bundled capacity and energy product of under \$73 per kW-year, or

(c) received bids below these thresholds but such bids included what the LSE believes are unreasonable terms and/or conditions, in which case the waiver request must demonstrate why such terms and/or conditions are unreasonable.

These requirements are necessary, but are not necessarily a sufficient basis for the Commission to grant waiver. The Commission will also consider other information brought to its attention regarding the reasonableness of the waiver request.

#### **JUSTIFICATION FOR WAIVER**

Consistent with the standards for local RA waivers set forth the 2020 Filing Guide, PCE engaged in good faith efforts to procure the resources required to meet all local RA requirements for years 2020-2022. Further details regarding these efforts and PCEs justifications for its waiver request are provided in PCE's supporting narrative, attached hereto as Appendix A.
