

## PROGRAMS FOR VULNERABLE GROUPS IN SAN MATEO COUNTY

Peninsula Clean Energy deploys programs to meet the needs of the most vulnerable groups within our community in addition to programs aimed at reducing carbon emissions and providing savings on electric vehicles and home upgrades. In light of public safety power shutoffs and the pandemic-induced economic hardship, these programs have been especially important in our community.

### Portable backup batteries for medical devices

The Power On Peninsula program provides free Yeti 3000X portable batteries to residents with medical devices who live in areas vulnerable to power shutoffs or high fire threat districts in San Mateo County. Compatible portable solar panels were provided for some residents to recharge their battery in the case of multi-day outages. Our program partners helped eligible residents to enroll in the medical baseline rate program.

### Low-income bill credit

To provide bill relief to low-income customers who struggled during the pandemic and shelter-in-place, Peninsula Clean Energy quickly implemented this \$3.6M program in April 2020 to provide an automatic \$100 bill credit to the 36,000 customers on CARE and FERA rate plans.

### Small business bill credit

To help small businesses impacted by the economic downturn during the pandemic, this \$1.55M program provided \$250 bill credits for up to 6,000 qualifying small businesses and a \$50,000 donation for small business support by the Renaissance Entrepreneurship Center.

The Drive Forward Electric program offers up to \$4,000 in rebates for income-qualifying San Mateo County residents to purchase a used electric vehicle. Rebates can be stacked with regional and state programs.
